Culture of Error

Action Step	What: Educators will build a Culture of Error in their classrooms so that students may build self-efficacy by feeling safe making and discussing mistakes.
Break It Down	How: <ul style="list-style-type: none">❑ Expect Error<ul style="list-style-type: none">❑ Make a list of the reasons that you tend to make mistakes.❑ How would you like others to think of you when you make mistakes?❑ How can you apply this to your thinking about student error?❑ Withhold the Answer<ul style="list-style-type: none">❑ Pose a question, and then allow multiple students to provide their answers.❑ Allow ample time for students to discuss which answer is correct and why.❑ The teacher then stamps the correct answer and why the answer is correct after ample student discussion time.❑ Praise and Reward the Pursuit of Knowledge<ul style="list-style-type: none">❑ Encourage students to ask questions and talk through their productive struggle while learning.❑ Ask for and reward student thinking that identifies gaps and points of error.❑ Celebrate growth and progress rather than results, particularly for struggling students.❑ Praise risk taking.
