




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Who We Are


Our Vision and Mission

Message from the Executive Director

The Gentlemen's League has experienced an incredibly successful year, marked by significant achievements and advancements in our mission to empower boys of color. We have strengthened our Board of Directors, added dynamic leaders from diverse backgrounds, and established a new hypothesis that focuses on creating environments where boys of color feel seen, heard, and deeply known. Our expanded team structure, including the hiring of program coordinators, has allowed us to be more hands-on in schools, provide comprehensive training, and introduce new programming components. We have also achieved remarkable growth by adding five additional schools, increasing enrollment by 75% to serve a total of 231 Boys of Color. Through media recognition, sharing best practices, expanding our Blackout Weekend event, scholarship opportunities, and being named the 2023 Affiliate Organization of the Year by the Mentor Memphis Grizzlies Organization, we have further solidified our position as a premier mentoring model. With gratitude and enthusiasm, we look forward to continuing our work to improve the lives of Boys of Color in Memphis.



End of the Year Banquet


